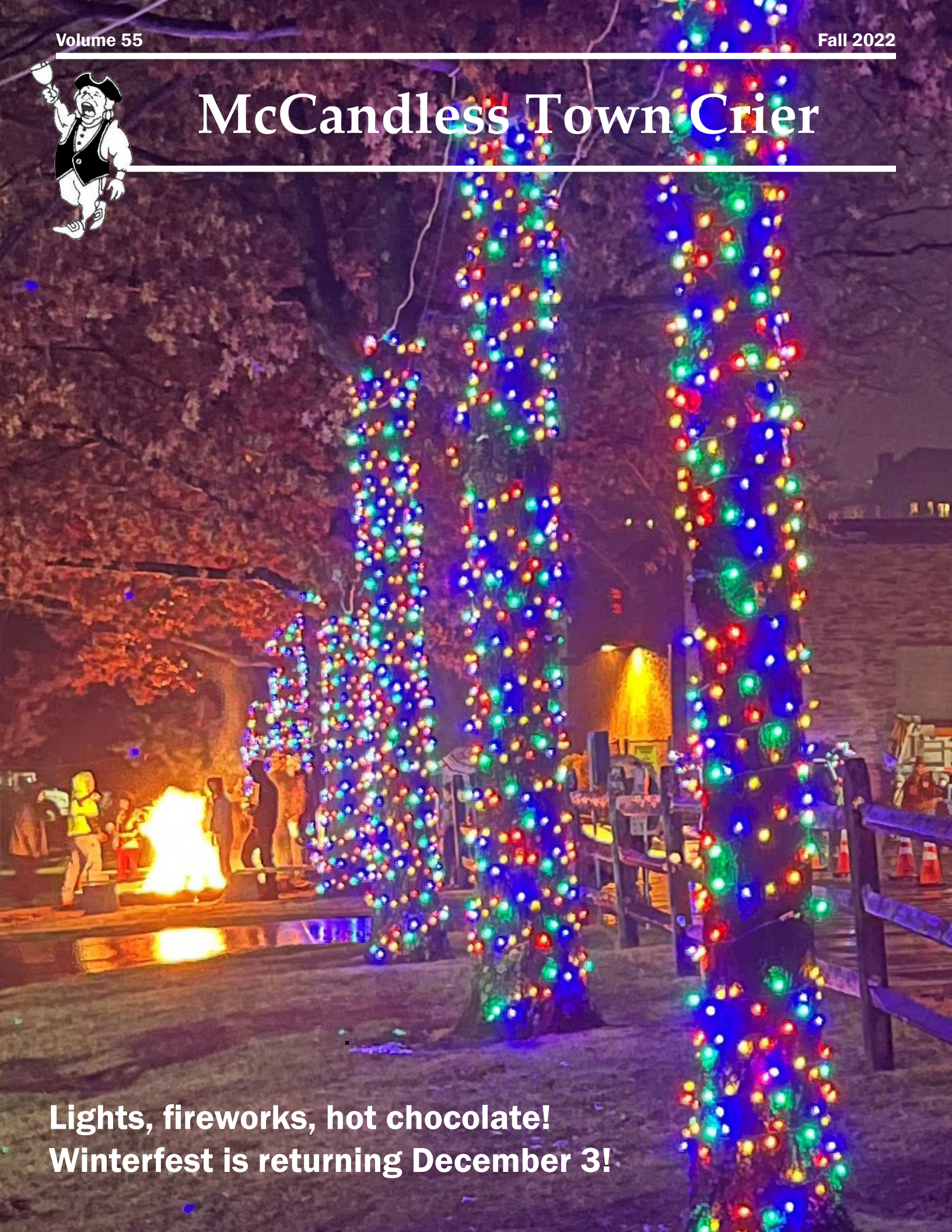

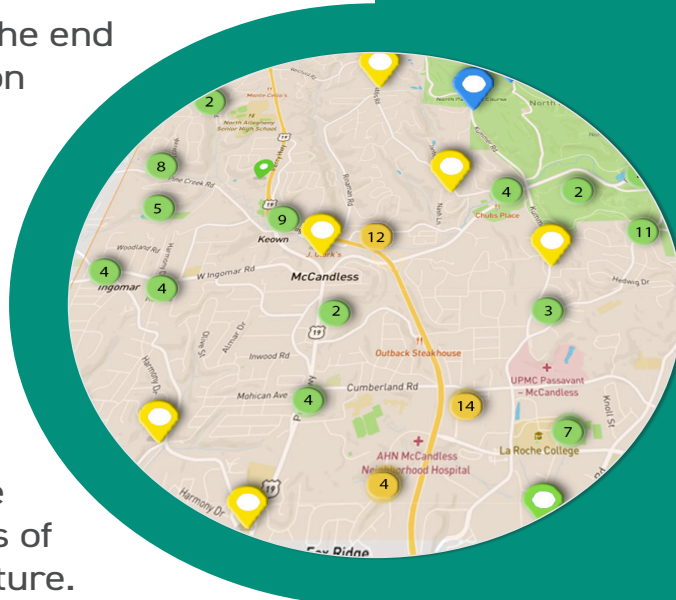
TOWN OF MCCANDLESS Zoning Modernization

Don't worry, use the At Your Door HHW and E-Waste Collection!

As a part of the contract with Waste Management, residents have a convenient opportunity to dispose of **Household Hazardous Waste** — such as cleaners, chemicals and automotive products — and **E-Waste** — such as old computers, televisions and other electronics.

The At Your Door HHW and E-Waste Collection program allows residents to easily dispose of these often difficult-to-recycle items at no cost.

How to participate...

First, you have to schedule your collection.
There are three ways to do this:

2. Call 1-800-449-7587 (Mon-Fri 8 am to 8 pm)
3. E-mail AtYourDoor@WM.com

The call center operators will guide you through the steps toward a safe and successful collection. You will be asked several questions, including your address and the type and amount of materials available for the pick up. You will be provided a convenient collection date and information about where to place the kit for collection. A kit will be sent to your home in plenty of time for you to gather and pack your materials.

Social work interns start in police department



Victoria Spreng and Taylor Detrich started as social work interns in the police department at the end of August.

Both are graduate students in the social work program at Slippery Rock University, and they will be working in the department until May 2023.

They will go out on calls with officers as needed to assess and provide crisis stabilization, and will conduct follow-up counseling as needed.

Victoria, 34, and Taylor, 22, are hoping to help strengthen the community and its relationship with local law enforcement,

and connect people in need to crucial (but often less-known) resources.

"My hope for this program is an efficient interdisciplinary partnership of law enforcement and mental health professionals coming together to provide behavioral health assistance where law enforcement is not warranted," said Police Chief Ryan Hawk. "This program is unlike anything we have done in the past."



The McCandless Police Department will be collecting items this year for North Hills Community Outreach now through December 20.

Items collected include toys, toiletries, cleaning products, paper towels, baby wipes and diapers (sizes 4,5 and 6).
