State grants help fund important projects

In 2024, the Town received several state grants to assist with crucial public projects:

- \$142,418 in Multimodal Transportation Fund (MTF) grants for construction of new sidewalks and ADA ramps along North Meadow Drive.
- \$98,931 from the Greenways, Trails, and Recreation Program to the Town of McCandless for the creation of a Parks Master Site Development Plan and Town Trail Feasibility Study.
- \$166,000 in Local Share Account (LSA) funding for will go to repair bridges along Blazier Drive, Meinert Road, and Old Perry Highway. These repairs will include crack sealing, guiderail repairs, vegetation and sediment removal, and delamination repairs.
- \$60,485 in LSA funding to help purchase new police vehicles.

New Town Manager hired



Town Council on August 26 voted unanimously to appoint John Schwend to serve as the new Town Manager.

"Thank you for the opportunity to serve the residents of the Town of McCandless. I hope to provide an exceptional level of service to the community for many years to come," he said.

Prior to this, Schwend was the manager of Edgeworth borough.

He has a bachelor's degree from Allegheny College in business and managerial economics, and a Master's degree in public policy management from the University of Pittsburgh.

A lifelong Hampton Township resident, he also serves as the president and chairman of the board of the Hampton Township Volunteer Fire Department.

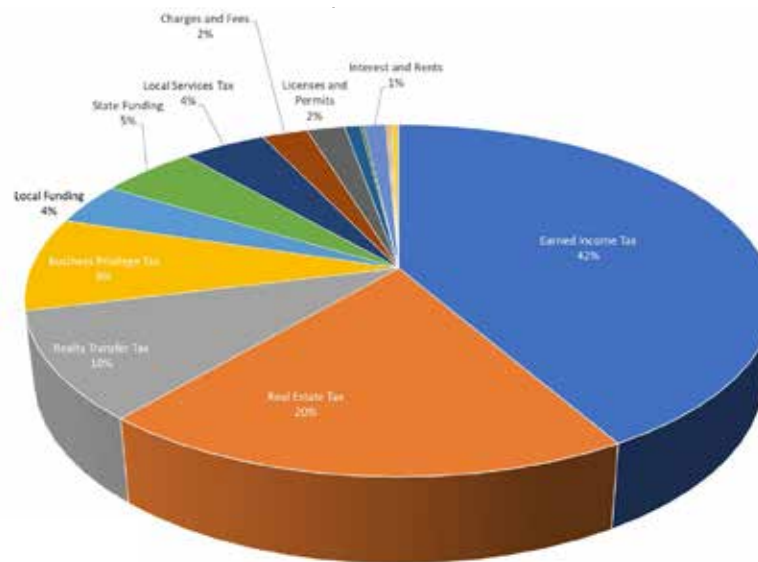
Schwend replaced Brian O'Malley, who left earlier this year to serve as manager at Richland Township.

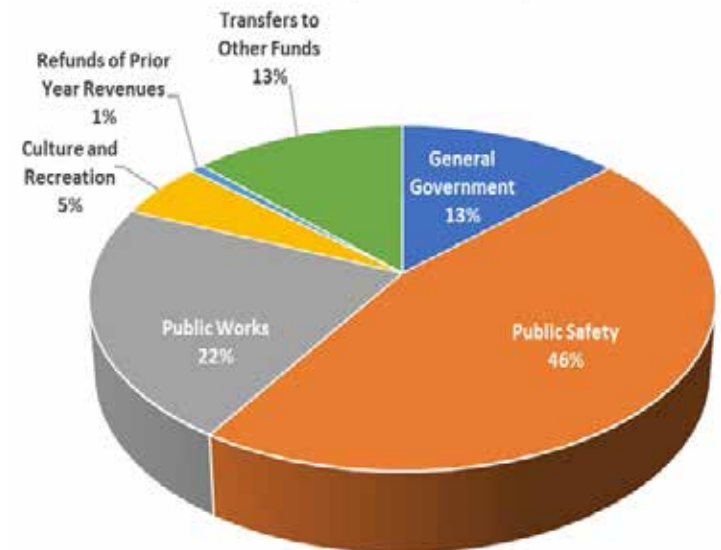

Tax info for 2025

Real Estate Tax

The Town collects the real estate tax for both the municipality and the North Allegheny School District for all properties located within the confines of the Town. The tax is calculated by multiplying the tax rate by the assessed value of your home or property.

It is important that you pay your tax by the due dates below, even if you have filed an appeal with Allegheny County. Once a deadline passes, the higher amount must be paid, even if you win your appeal. In addition, failure to pay your tax by December 31 may result in a lien being placed against your property.

2025 Real Estate Tax Deadlines

- July 1: Real estate tax bills will be mailed
- September 2: Last day to pay real estate taxes at the 2% discount amount
- October 31: Last day to pay real estate taxes at the face amount
- December 31: Last day to pay real estate taxes before they become delinquent

If you choose to take advantage of the installment payment program, the due dates for 2025 follow:

- September 2: First installment due
- October 31: Second installment due
- December 31: Third installment due

Per Capita Tax

The North Allegheny School District did not levy the per capita tax for the 2024-2025 tax year. Any outstanding taxes from prior years remain due.

Earned Income and Net Profits Tax

Keystone Collections Group collects the earned income and net profits tax for both the Town and the North Allegheny School District for all residents of McCandless. The tax is based on salaries, wages, and net profits earned throughout the year. This tax is withheld by employers and forwarded on a quarterly basis. If you are self-employed or receive compensation for which taxes are not withheld, you must file and pay the tax quarterly.

Under this law, employers are required to have Certificate of Residence forms on file for their employees. When filling out the form, please note that the Town of McCandless PSD code is 710704.

Local Service Tax

Keystone Collections Group collects the local services tax for the Town. This tax applies to

any individual who works in the Town at any time during the calendar year, and the rate is \$52 per calendar year.

The tax is withheld by employers and forwarded on a quarterly basis. If you are self-employed or receive compensation for which taxes are not withheld, then you should forward \$13 per quarter.

Business Privilege Tax

The Business Privilege Tax is a gross receipts tax levied for the privilege of doing certain types of business in the Town. New businesses in the Town must register and obtain a license. New business profile forms are available on the website or contact the tax office. The tax return and payment are due on May 15. The tax office will accept returns as timely if postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service on or before the due date. All returns postmarked after the due date will be considered late and subject to penalty and interest.

Drop Box Procedures

Please note that tax payments placed in the drop box or hand delivered are accepted as timely for the following 2025 tax deadlines: May 15 (Business Privilege Tax), September 2 (Real Estate Tax at discount) and October 31 (Real Estate Tax at face).

As a part of the Town's contract with Waste Management, residents have a convenient new opportunity to dispose of **Household Hazardous Waste** — such as cleaners, chemicals and automotive products — and **E-Waste** — such as old computers, televisions and other electronics.

The At Your Door HHW and E-Waste Collection program allows residents to easily dispose of these often difficult-to-recycle items.

How to participate...

First, you have to schedule your collection. There are three ways to do this:

3. E-mail AtYourDoor@WM.com

The call center operators will guide you through the steps toward a safe and successful collection. You will be asked several questions, including your address and the type and amount of materials available for the pick up. You will be provided a convenient collection date and information about where to place the kit for collection. A kit will be sent to your home in plenty of time for you to gather and pack your materials.

Let Them Fall Where They May!

The Ecological and Economic Impact of Grass Clippings

Lawn grasses provide many benefits to our immediate environment. Soil erosion control, improved protection of groundwater, improvement of the quality of life through noise and dust abatement, improvements of air quality, and aesthetic and recreational contributions are some of the assets provided by turfgrasses. However, disposal of grass clippings requires the attention of homeowners to be a good land steward!

The common practice of treating grass clippings as waste is resulting in overloaded landfills and stormwater pollution. Grass clippings left on the streets and sidewalks pollute waterbodies by entering nearby storm drains. Excessive algae growth is a detrimental outcome of yard waste pollution in streams, lakes, and ponds throughout the country. At large amounts, algae can be harmful to fish and humans by limiting the amount of oxygen in the water. In addition to algae growth, grass clippings can also clog storm drains resulting in potential flooding and expensive maintenance to correct the problem.



Grass Pollution Prevention

Leave it on the Lawn – A mulching lawnmower shreds the clippings and leaves them on the grass to decompose. Mulching not only prevents stormwater pollution, it also provides moisture and fertilizer for the lawn.

Backyard Composting – If grass clippings are typically bagged then backyard composting is another solution to pollution prevention. Home compost piles are becoming increasingly popular among residents. Adding grass to the compost pile provides both moisture and nitrogen allowing for more rapid decomposition. Composting yard waste is not necessarily restricted to a dedicated compost pile, mulching a garden is an additional option. Grass clippings provide natural fertilizer through nitrogen, potassium, and some phosphorus components. However, if weed killers were recently used on the lawn then it's unadvisable to mulch the garden.

Less Frequent Lawn Mowing – Mowing your grass less can be beneficial and prevent weeds from growing. Cutting only the top 1/3 of the grass blades will shade out some weeds and encourage deep root systems. Additionally, leaving 2 to 3 inches of grass keeps most of the nutrients in. However, it is important to check with Municipal or HOA regulations before letting the grass get too high.

Home Safety Checklist

Smoke Alarms

- Install smoke alarms inside and outside each bedroom and sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home including the basement.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month.
- Change the batteries to your smoke alarms at least once a year.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.

Cooking Safety

- Cooking area is free from items that can catch fire.
- Stay in the kitchen when frying, grilling or broiling food.
- Do not put anything metal in the microwave.

- Have a fire extinguisher near the kitchen area.
- Never put water on a grease fire.

Electrical Safety

- Do not put electrical cords under doors or rugs.
- Do not use electrical cords that are frayed or cracked.
- Use ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) to reduce the risk of shock.
- Plug large and small appliances directly into wall outlets.

Carbon Monoxide Alarms

- Stop using power strips or chargers if they are hot to the touch or have an unusual smell.
- Carbon monoxide alarms are located outside sleeping areas and on each level of the home.
- Carbon monoxide can be caused

by a clogged or malfunctioning gas furnace, dryer, stove or fireplace.

- Replace carbon monoxide alarms more than 7 years old.

Candle Safety

- Candles are in sturdy fire-proof containers that won't be tipped over.
- All candles are extinguished before going to bed or leaving the room.
- Children and pets are never left unattended with candles.

Heating Safety

- Chimney and furnace are cleaned and inspected yearly.
- Furniture and other items that can catch fire are at least 3 feet from fireplaces, wall heaters, baseboards, and space heaters.
- Fireplace and barbecue ashes are placed outdoors in a covered metal container at least 3 feet

from anything that can catch fire.

- Extension cords are never used with space heaters.
- Heaters are approved by a national testing laboratory and have tip-over shut-off function.
- Never use your oven or stove to heat the house.

Home Escape Plan

- Have two ways out of each room.
- Know to crawl low to the floor when escaping to avoid toxic smoke.
- Know that once you're out, stay out.
- Know where to meet after the escape.
- Meeting place should be near the front of your home, so fire-fighters know you are out.
- Practice your fire escape plan !!!

McCandless Department of Public Works — helping you live, laugh and love when the snow covers the road

The Town of McCandless snow and ice control program provides for the salting and plowing of snow from streets within the Town. This vital maintenance service is performed on 110 miles of Town roads and 20.12 miles of state owned roads. This state road mileage encompasses all state roads in the Town with the exception of Route 19 and McKnight Road, but includes their ramps. Public Works Department crews also offer plowing to approximately 18 miles of private roads in times of heavy snowfall (6"+ accumulation) upon request.

All **sidewalks** must be cleared in a reasonable amount of time as circumstances permit, preferably within 24-hours after a snowfall. Please do not shovel or blow snow from the sidewalk onto to the street.

Public Works has the road system in the town broken into 9 routes. There is one truck assigned to each route.

The salt storage facility is at Town Hall and salt trucks must refill several times to complete a single route.

If your street is at the end of a route, it may take longer to service your road, but all roads will be serviced as quickly as possible.

We will not alter any route under any circumstances, as each route has been calculated for efficiency.
