IDENTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN

At the suggestion of council members a Personal Fingerprint Identification Program for Children will be conducted by the McCandless Police Department during the month of August. Fingerprints will be taken at the police department each Friday and Saturday from 9 a.m. until 12 Noon. Parents wishing to participate in the program should call the police secretary at 364-2250 for an appointment.

The program is available to school children (Kindergarten through Grade 5) who reside in McCandless. Participation is entirely voluntary. Because of state law, parents have to sign a "Permission Form For Child's Fingerprinting". Children will then have the prints placed on a Personal Identification form which will be given to the child's parents. IF REQUESTED BY PARENTS, a duplicate form will be filed at the police department.

Youth Officer James Miller and Detective Gary Anderson will conduct the fingerprinting. They stated that young children are difficult to "print" because of their small fingers. However, if parents of pre-school children wish identification prints taken, an attempt will be made with parents' assistance.

Chief Patrick McCabe emphasized the identification program is absolutely voluntary and NO fingerprints will remain in department files UNLESS specifically requested by a parent. He added, "Hopefully a child's fingerprints will never have to be used for identification. But, if only one instance of future use is needed, the program will be well worth the Police Department's time and effort."

FIRE DEPARTMENT ROAD-E-O

Peebles District Volunteer Fire Department of McCandless sponsored the second (2nd) annual truck road-e-o on Saturday, May 7, 1983, held in the Showcase Cinema North's parking lot. Volunteers from Berkeley Hills Volunteer Fire Department of Ross Township, Marshall Township Volunteer Fire Department, North Hampton Volunteer Fire Department of Hampton Township and Highland, Ingomar and Peebles (all of McCandless) were contestants.

There were a total of eight (8) tests of driving skills maneuvering their equipment with a possible score of 550 points. They were as follows: Off-set alley, alley docking, parallel parking, straight line, serpentine (forwards and reverse), turning around, diminishing clearance, and final stop line.

The following skills were awarded by six (6) trophies from the Peebles District Volunteer Fire Department of the Town of McCandless and presented by Chief Jim Arthur. Winners were Dave Neel of Peebles

SURPLUS FOOD DISTRIBUTED

Free food (5 lbs. cheese and 1 lb. butter) was distributed to area residents on April 23rd, May 19th and June 16th. Those eligible included Disabled American Veterans, people over 65 years in age and unemployed persons. Over 840 people registered and received cheese and butter. Costs of storing food for the program will be underwritten by the North Pittsburgh Community Development Corporation.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS

Several developments approved by Town Council are now well into their formulative stage as reported by Bill Nolan, Planning and Zoning Dept. Director.

The development being done by Radice Realty, Inc. at the corner of Babcock Blvd. and McKnight Rd. is well under way. Corporate Drive has been paved and will be opened sometime during the summer. In addition, Babcock Blvd. has been re-aligned and straightened to eliminate some hazardous curves. It is anticipated Babcock Blvd. will be closed again during the summer to straighten one last curve. Radice expects initial occupancy of their first building early in July and intends to break ground for the second building this fall.

Two additional subdivisions are in the final completion stages. They are the Valley Run 9 lot subdivision owned by Prescott Cole and located at the corner of Rochester Road and Sloop Road; and the Meadow Oaks #2 16 lot subdivision located off Duncan Avenue.

A third subdivision, Kummer Farms #1 entailing 4 lots was previously approved by the Town. This subdivision is located on Kummer Road and is owned by Jack Schweiger and William Baierl.

HOW “TOT-FINDER” WORKS

The Town of McCandless's three (3) Volunteer Fire Companies use fire rescue decals for location of children in single and multi-family dwellings if a child is trapped in his/her room and cut off from rescue. Highly visible during the day and reflective from a light source at night, it is a priority to the firemen arriving at the scene of a fire.

Primary locations for the weather-resistant decal are: (1) windows of the children's rooms facing outside, (2) at bottom of interior doors facing into hallway.

“Tot Finder” decals are free upon request at the Highland, Ingomar and Peebles Fire Department or from Richard Wagner, Fire Marshal, at the Town Hall.



COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

JANUARY 3, 1983

Ordinance #857 was adopted which authorizes a borrowing in anticipation of current taxes and current revenue and issuance of a tax certification note for the calendar year of 1983.

The following individuals were appointed to the noted authorities and boards: Walter F. McCutcheon (McCandless Township Sanitary Authority), George P. Boucek (McCandless Industrial Development Authority), and C. Dean Woodcock (Northland Public Library Authority). Their terms are to start immediately and expire the first Monday of January, 1988.

Raymond Fleckenstein (Town of McCandless Zoning Hearing Board), and Joan Glavin (Town of McCandless Personnel Board). Their terms are to start immediately and expire December 31, 1985.

Resolution #1 of 1983 was adopted which established the amount when competitive bidding shall not be required for contracts for labor, material or services.

The North Hills News Record, Pittsburgh Press and Pittsburgh Post Gazette were appointed official newspapers for the Town's legal notices.

JANUARY 24, 1983

Ordinance #858 was adopted which amended Ordinance #848 that reapportioned the various wards of the Town of McCandless.

Resolution #2 of 1983 was adopted which named Mellon Bank as an additional depository for the investment of surplus funds.

Resolution #3 of 1983 was adopted which endorsed the continuation of the Federal Revenue Sharing Program.

Ordinance #859 was adopted which renamed a portion of Blum Road to Bauer Drive.

An agreement was entered into with Animal Protection Services, Inc. for the general control and pick up of dogs in the Town of McCandless at a price of \$250.00 per month beginning January 1, 1983 and expiring December 31, 1985.

FEBRUARY 14, 1983

The resignation of R. L. Von Hofen as Town Manager for the Town of McCandless was accepted with the resignation to be effective February 28, 1983.

Edith M. Liguori was appointed Acting Town Manager, Acting Secretary and Acting Tax Collector for the Town of McCandless with the appointment to be effective February 14, 1983.

Resolution #4 of 1983 was adopted naming Pittsburgh National Bank as the Town depository for General Fund money and special funds.

Resolution #5 of 1983 was adopted which reestablished a deposit account with Equibank for the payment of hospitalization costs.

FEBRUARY 28, 1983

A public hearing was held on an ordinance tentatively identified as Ordinance #853, vacating as a public street the northernmost portion of Sheffield Drive in the Talleybrooke Plan of Lots so that the northernmost terminus of Sheffield Drive shall not fully extend to the northern plan line of Talleybrooke Plan of Lots.

A contract was awarded to Budget Uniform Service, the lowest responsible bidder, for supplying uniforms to the Public Works Department for a price of \$51.50 per week.

MARCH 28, 1983

Resolution #6 of 1983, an amendment to the Articles of Incorporation of the McCandless Township Sanitary Authority, was adopted.

Resolution #7 of 1983, a resolution of the Town of McCandless adopting an employees Deferred Compensation Plan and authorizing the execution of agreements relating to said plan, was adopted.

Ordinance #860 was adopted which vacated as a public street the northernmost portion of Sheffield Drive in the Talleybrooke Plan of Lots so that the northernmost terminus of Sheffield Drive shall not fully extend to the northern Talleybrooke Plan line.

Ordinance #861 was adopted which established a stop sign at the intersection of Woodview Drive and Broadlawn Drive.

APRIL 25, 1983

Dr. Volker Breitfeld and Robert W. Dittmar were appointed to the Town of McCandless Planning Commission with the terms to start immediately and expire December 31, 1986.

Five police cars were sold to the highest responsible bidders for a total of \$6,501.18.

The preliminary plat application of Kummer Farms Plan #2 regular subdivision was approved as submitted by William Baierl and Jack Schweiger for their property located on Kummer Road.

The preliminary plat application of the Valley Run Subdivision as proposed by Prescott Cole and located on Sloop Road at Rochester Road was approved contingent upon Mr. Cole being able to secure the necessary approvals and permits from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Resources and the Federal Flood Insurance Administration.

A contract was awarded to Allegheny Ford, the lowest responsible bidder, for the purchase of a cab and chassis at a price of \$9,540.00.

A contract was awarded to Shauall Equipment Company for the purchase of a tractor/loader/backhoe at a price of \$15,057.00.

A contract was awarded to Wine Construction Company, the lowest responsible bidder, for scarification and dust oil treatment on various Town roads at a price per square yard of 98¢ and a total price of \$17,267.60.

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MORE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

Approximately eight miles of Town roads were resurfaced, profiled and resurfaced or totally reconstructed in 1982 at a cost of \$648,000. Twenty-seven roads and streets were included in the program. Town road improvements in 1983 involve twenty-nine (29) roads and streets at an estimated cost of \$646,256.00.

— Construction of soccer fields on Ingomar Road is progressing. They may be available for use in the Fall.

— Complaints are being received concerning dogs running-at-large. This is in violation of Town Ordinances and owners are subject to fine. Residents are also reminded that dogs must be licensed and certified to have inoculations every three years.

— A request by Boy Scout Troops to paint house numbers on curbs fronting residences has been approved by Council. A donation of \$2.00 is being asked of residents who wish to have this done.

— All Town employees, elected officials and appointed boards and commissions members have been issued photo-identification

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MAY 23, 1983

Public hearing held on an ordinance tentatively identified as Ordinance #862, changing the use district from R-2 (one and two family residential) to C-5 (commercial resident) for .9 acre of land located on Babcock Blvd. across from the Vincentian Sisters of Charity property as requested by Radice Realty Corporation.

Ordinance #862 was adopted which approved the editing and inclusion of certain ordinances as parts of the various component codes of the Codified Ordinances of the Town of McCandless.

Ordinance #863 was adopted which established fire lanes at La Roche College and the Sisters of Divine Providence Motherhouse.

Resolution #9 of the 1983 Series, making application for a permit to install and operate traffic signals at Ingomar Road, Wildwood Road and Babcock Blvd. subject to the approval of the Secretary of Transportation, was adopted.

The following contracts were awarded: Allegheny Ford Truck Sales, the lowest responsible bidder, for two diesel powered dump trucks at a net price of \$53,100.00; Northern Industries, Inc., the lowest responsible bidder, for the reconstruction and resurfacing of certain Town roads at an estimated total cost of \$646,256.00; Carnegie Tar & Asphalt Company for ID-2 binder at a price of \$24.00 per ton F.O.B. and \$25.00 per ton delivered; Carnegie Tar & Asphalt Company, the lowest responsible bidder, for ID-2 top at a price of \$26.00 per ton F.O.B. and \$27.50 per ton delivered; Heilman Paving Specialties, the lowest responsible bidder, for cold patch at a price of \$31.20 per ton delivered; Purvis Brothers, Inc. at a price of \$.849 per gallon for diesel fuel, \$.863 per gallon for regular gasoline, and \$.907 per gallon for unleaded gasoline delivered; Lane Metal Products, for the purchase of polymer coated corrugated metal pipe; and Coco Trucking, Inc. for gravel, limestone and slag.

Contracts were also awarded to: Allegheny Foundry Company, Inc. for 4' inlet, frame and grate at a price of \$305.00 each and Type M inlet, frame and grate at a price of \$255.00 each; Rochez Brothers, the lowest responsible bidder, for rock salt (NaCl), at a price of \$24.98 per ton delivered; Rochez Brothers, the lowest responsible bidder, for cinders at a price of \$12.90 per ton delivered; and, P.B. & S. Chemical Company for calcium chloride Type I flake at a price of \$250.00 per ton delivered.

TOWN ROADS CLEANED

Boy Scout Troop 329, of Memorial Park U.P. Church, participated in April's "Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful Day". Scouts, along with their Scout Leader and Assistant, picked up debris along two miles of secondary state roads. This included (both sides): a section of Peebles Road; Duncan Ave. from Peebles Road to Babcock Blvd.; and, Babcock Blvd. from Duncan Ave. to Hedwig Drive. PennDot supplied the truck to pick up filled litter bags and crews for traffic safety.



McCandless Public Works Department personnel removed litter and debris from all other secondary state roads two to three weeks prior to this clean-up. The Town wishes to thank all those who participated.

RECREATION PROGRAM 10 YEARS OLD

A Joint Recreation Board was formed 10 years ago to provide vacation-time activities for McCandless, Bradford Woods, Franklin Park and Marshall Township students. The Board is comprised of one member from each municipality and the North Allegheny School Board. Gerard J. Aufman, Jr. is the McCandless Representative and serves as Board Chairman.

Sponsored and funded by the four municipalities, the program is supervised by paid personnel. Over 500 students participated in this year's program conducted at Bradford Woods Elementary School, Espe Elementary School, Ingomar Elementary School, Peebles Elementary School, Ingomar Middle School, North Allegheny Intermediate School, Warrendale Park and North Allegheny High School. The latter is used for 1 two-week swimming instruction program. All school facilities are rented from the North Allegheny School District by the Joint Recreation Board.

Each participating student pays a \$3.00 service fee (including insurance) for arts and craft classes in addition to group games and story-telling time. Special events days such as bike inspections (conducted by McCandless Police Officer, James Miller) and a bike parade are held each year.

The Joint Recreation Board also provides a winter program for exceptional children at Cumberland School.

— Trail-bikes and go-carts are not permitted on Town roads and streets. They must be operated on private property ONLY with the written permission of the property owner.

— There have been changes in State House Representatives because of redistricting within the Town. Now representing you in Harrisburg are: Ward 1 — Brian Clark; Wards 2, 3 and 4 — George Pott; and, Wards 5, 6 and 7 — Richard Cessar.

— Real Estate Tax Notices were mailed on July 1, 1983. If you do not receive a notice by July 15, 1983, please contact the tax office by phoning Audrey Graper or Millie Barnhart at 364-0616.

— Crime rate per-capita in the Town of McCandless is the 14th lowest, nationwide, according to the Figge Report issued by Research and Forecasts of New York. Town police personnel credit residents care in safeguarding their property for this outstanding

record. They are also reminding residents that during vacation time greater care must be exercised. Anything of suspicious nature should be reported to the police department immediately. Be alert for your own safety and that of your neighbors!

— ATTENTION TEENAGERS! Are you looking for some part-time employment? Contact the Odd Job Bureau at Northland Library. Through this program teenagers who are willing to do Odd Jobs — mowing yards, garden work, babysitting, cleaning house, etc. — are matched with adults in the community who need this type of work performed. The employer will contact you directly by telephone. To apply for this program, come to the library between 2-4 p.m. on Mondays. This service is free and open to all residents of Ross, McCandless, Franklin Park, and Bradford Woods.


